
## Creating an "Insta-Snow" or "Slush Powder" packet by Jay Rosenberg

- 1) Gather the following supplies:
  - a. Snow or Slush Powder
  - b. Scissors
  - c. Scotch tape
  - d. Plain facial tissue




2) Cut off about an inch long strip of tissue parallel to the fold, and about a 2-inch long strip perpendicular to the fold, and discard these strips:



3) You now have an approximately square piece of tissue with a natural fold down the middle. Cut this tissue into four equal quarters. This will yield 4 powder packets:




4) Place three of the tissue pieces to the side for now. Take some of your snow/slush powder and place it into the center of one of the tissues. In the pictures below, I am using 1 teaspoon (5 cc) of powder:




5) Now you are going to fold the tissue packet to enclose the powder in. Imagine folding the packet into 9 equal squares, like a tic-tac-toe board. You don't have to pre-fold the tissue this way if you don't want to, but it helps to visualize it. See picture below:



6) Fold one side down, and then the opposite side:




7) Fold bottom third up and then stand the packet up to allow the powder to settle to the bottom:




8) Fold the top third down to complete the folding process:



9) Take a piece of tape about 1/3 inch long and affix it to the end of the packet:



10) Here is the finished product:



11) If you make both snow and slush packets, you may want to label them with a small marking. I use an "L" for Slush Powder and an "N" for Snow Powder:



12) Your packets are ready to use! Here is one in finger palm:



## Notes:

- I have experimented with gift tissue paper, as well as toilet tissue. I like using plain, non-lotion Kleenex. Your mileage may vary.
- You do NOT have to even stir the mixture to activate it. If you drop the packet into a cup and then add the water, the water will quickly leach into the packet and cause the packet to break open.
- I use both layers of a 2-ply tissue. For me, one layer is too thin and delicate.
- I make about 8 packets at once and store them in a large pill bottle from the pharmacy. This is crush-proof and I can bring it in my magic case or even my briefcase when I go to work.

I hope you enjoy and use this technique. I have no idea if someone has ever documented this before me, but I can tell you that I did independently come up with this technique after much trial and error. My apologies if there is someone who should be receiving credit for this but is not.
